


## Gate Opening and Closing

Many people have asked about the gate being closed and if that means the park is closed. We don't have the resources to have the gate opened and closed each day, but the park is open 365 days a year during daylight hours. At this time the gate is opened during programs and special events only. At all other times parking is

available at the Walnut Street entrance or in the area in front of the gate at the end of Wilhelm Lane.

Trails can be accessed from either entrance so don't let a closed gate keep you from enjoying the park.





# Winter Bird Watching

Oh the joys of winter bird watching. While winter may not be your favorite season it offers opportunities for bird lovers to bring their favorite species in close. No need to get bundled up or spend hours searching the sky, a full feeder will soon turn your yard into a hub bub of beautiful birds.

Find a spot where you can enjoy the activity from the comfort of your home, choose a feeder, fill it with choice seed and let the show begin. Try and pick a place with some built in protection, near a bush or large tree. You also want to have the feeder out of reach of the family pets. A good choice for beginners is a sunflower feeder. Filled with black oil sunflower seeds these feeders will attract a variety of local birds including chickadees, cardinals, woodpeckers, blue jays, titmice, nuthatches and goldfinch. Avoid the cheaper

commercial mixes as they contain a lot of filler seed which ends up going to waste. Of course some seed will still end up on the ground, which will be appreciated by ground feeders



such as mourning doves and juncos.

Many people get discouraged when the "bully" birds or squirrels raid the feeders and scare away the smaller more colorful birds. There are many squirrel proofing methods available and some actually work. One trick is to purchase a feeder with a built in wire cage so
